

LOYALTY POINTS AT A GLANCE

SENIORITY POINTS AWARDED

These points are given to all students at the start of each academic year and will be added before the start of each football season (prior to the first distribution). Points are awarded based on class standing as per USC-Columbia credit hours. The point distribution for seniority is as follows:

Freshman – 3 points

Sophomore – 4 points

Junior – 6 points

Senior – 8 points

Grad student – 6 points

LOYALTY POINTS (AWARDED)

Loyalty Points are awarded for attending each game.

The amount of points awarded depends on the type of game being attended. For football and basketball, Southeastern Conference (SEC) games are worth fewer points than non-conference games because there is less of a demand for these games. For baseball, all games are worth the same number of loyalty points.

Loyalty Points are distributed as follows:

**Football and Basketball:
SEC games – 1 point
Non-SEC games – 2 points**

**Baseball:
All games – 1 point**

LOYALTY POINTS (LOST)

Loyalty Points are taken away from students who claim tickets but do not attend that game. They are also taken away from students who cancel past the designated cutoff time. This is to detract students from being “no-shows” so that we can have the most possible students at each home game. Loyalty Points are lost as follows:

For “no-shows”:

**Football and Basketball:
SEC games – 1 point lost
Non-SEC games – 2 points lost**

**Baseball:
All games – 1 point lost**

If you cancel after the cutoff time but before game time, you will lose half of the available points for that specified game.

POINTS ROLLED OVER

Each year, 10% of a student’s total points will be rolled over to the next year. The rollover will occur at the end of each academic year and will be applied starting with the football season in the fall.

This will help to entice students to attend as many Gamecock athletic events as possible to help increase turnout to all sporting events here at USC. At this point in time, the system only applies to football, men’s/women’s basketball and baseball. More sports will be added in due time. An example of rollover is:

10 points total – 1 point rollover

30 points total – 3 points rollover

50 points total – 5 points rollover
